

**RESOLUTION 2001-12**

**A RESOLUTION OF THE TOWNSHIP OF UPPER SOUTHAMPTON, COUNTY OF BUCKS, COMMONWEALTH OF PENNSYLVANIA ESTABLISHING A THREE-WAY STOP INTERSECTION AT HARDING ROAD AND WILLOPENN DRIVE FOR A PERIOD NOT TO EXCEED NINETY (90) DAYS**

**WHEREAS**, Chapter 15, Subsection 105 of the Upper Southampton Township Code of Ordinances empowers the Board of Supervisors to designate places upon and along the highways in the Township where for a period of not more than ninety (90) days, specific traffic and/or parking regulation, prohibitions, and restrictions shall be in force and effect, and shall designate such locations by proper signs and markings in order to allow for the test and experimental determination of the feasibility and desirability of permanent changes in the Ordinances of the Township relative to traffic;

**WHEREAS**, The Board of Supervisors wishes to exercise the powers provided for in Chapter 15, Subsection 105 by creating a three-way stop intersection at Harding Road and Willopenn Drive for the purpose of determining whether it is desirable and feasible to permanently regulate this intersection

**NOW THEREFORE**, The Board of Supervisors of Upper Southampton Township, resolves:

1. That it shall be unlawful for the driver of any vehicle, traveling upon the stop street at the following intersections, in the direction or directions indicated in each case, to stop the vehicle as required by Section 3323(b) of the Vehicle Code, and shall not proceed into or across the intersecting or through street until all applicable requirements of that section of the Vehicle Code have been satisfied.


<u>Stop Street</u>	<u>Intersecting Through Street</u>	<u>Direction of Travel</u>
Willopenn Drive	Harding Road	East
Willopenn Drive	Harding Road	West
Harding Road	Willopenn Drive	North

2. That three-way stop signs be installed at the intersection of Willopenn Drive and Harding Road, as provided in Paragraph 1 above for a period not to exceed ninety (90) days for the determination of the feasibility and desirability of any permanent changes and are listed below in accordance with Chapter 15, Subsection 207 as established in the Upper Southampton Township Code of Ordinances.

3. Any person who shall violate the said regulation shall, upon conviction thereof, be subject to a fine of not more than twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) together with the cost of prosecution.
4. The provisions of Chapter 15, Subsection 105 are hereby fully incorporated herein by reference and made a part of this Resolution without attachment hereto.
5. This Resolution shall become immediately effective upon its enactment.
