

RESOLUTION #2010-25

A RESOLUTION OF THE TOWNSHIP OF UPPER SOUTHAMPTON, COUNTY OF BUCKS, COMMONWEALTH OF PENNSYLVANIA ESTABLISHING THE 2011 ASSESSMENT FOR THE COLLECTION, REMOVAL, AND DISPOSAL OF RESIDENTIAL SOLID WASTE, YARD WASTE, AND RECYCLABLE MATERIALS

WHEREAS, Upper Southampton Township collects solid waste, yard waste and recyclable materials for residential properties located in the Township; and

WHEREAS, Upper Southampton Township assesses each residential property on an annual basis to pay for said collection; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of the Township of Upper Southampton desires to establish the assessment for each residential property for the Year 2011 and establish the interest rate for failure to pay the assessment in accordance with the Second Class Township Code.


NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE TOWNSHIP OF UPPER SOUTHAMPTON THAT:

1. The 2011 assessment for the collection, removal and disposal of residential solid waste, yard waste, refuse materials, and recyclable materials for each residential property located in the Township of Upper Southampton shall be Three Hundred Forty Five and 00/100 Dollars (\$345.00).
2. The assessment shall be collected as part of the municipal tax bill for the year 2011.
3. In the event that the assessment is not part of the municipal tax bill, the Township may collect by separate invoice.
4. In the event that the 2011 assessment for the collection, removal, and disposal of solid waste, yard waste, refuse materials, and recyclable materials remains unpaid ninety days after the due date, the assessment shall be recovered by action of assumpsit along with interest at a rate of six percent (6%) per annum from the date the assessment was due as well as all costs incurred in the collection of the assessment.

5. This Resolution shall become effective upon enactment.
