REFUND POLICY

If We Cancel A Program: Upper Southampton Township Parks & Recreation reserves the right to cancel classes/activities due to insufficient enrollment or other unforeseen circumstances. Participants will be notified and full refunds given. Credit card refunds will be issued within three days of the class/activity being canceled. If payment was made by cash or check, refunds may take up to 30 days from the date the course/activity was canceled.

If Participant Withdraws/Cancels: To cancel a registration participants must contact Upper Southampton Township Parks & Recreation at 215-355-9781. PLEASE NOTE: Instructors are not authorized to issue refunds or credits.

Refund: If the Parks and Recreation Department is notified of a withdrawal at least seven full days prior to the start of the class/activity, a refund will be issued. Refunds are issued by check or credit to a credit card. A processing fee of \$5.00 per program will be assessed for all canceled programs. We do not give refunds for camps.

Credit: If the withdrawal is between 48 hours and seven days prior to the start of the program, a Parks & Recreation credit will be placed on your household account, to be applied for future programs. A processing fee of \$5.00 per program will be assessed for all canceled registrations.

Cancellation and Changes of Programs: All classes must have a minimum number of participants enrolled in order to be held. Upper Southampton Parks and Recreation Department reserves the right to cancel or make any necessary revisions.

NO CREDITS or REFUNDS for any program will be issued if the withdrawal request is made less than 48 hours prior to the start of the program. NO EXCEPTIONS!

This check will not be cashed unless you cancel less than 30 days prior to the event or damage has taken place at your event. If any damage has taken place or facility has been left with a mess or trash, your security deposit will not be refunded. *Security deposits vary per venue. (Gym: \$150/Rental; Pavilions: \$250/Rental; Lion's Grove: \$100/Rental; All Other Facilities: \$100/Rental)*
- **Refunds:** A full refund of rental fee and security deposit will be issued if cancellation is made no less than 30 days before scheduled rental. If cancellation is made less than 30 days before scheduled rental, the security deposit will not be refunded.

GIRLS UNLIMITED - Relational Aggression Program

Our Girls Unlimited programs promote an environment of trust, cooperation and respect. Toward this end we foster emotional and social intelligence. The natural outcome of this increases school attachment and academic performance. Society teaches girls at a young age to avoid conflict. Rather than confronting problems, girls tend to channel their hurt and anger, and often resort to relational aggression. Recent studies have found that relational aggression among girls begins as early as preschool!

GIRLS UNLIMITED (Continued)

Relational aggression harms others by damaging, manipulating or injuring an individual's relationships with his/her peers. It includes such hurtful behaviors as gossiping, spreading rumors, exclusion and power struggles. Most relational aggression takes place within intimate social circles, and occurs predominantly among girls. Girls often use friendships as a weapon to threaten or damage another person's feelings of social acceptance. The lasting effect of relational aggression includes anxiety, loneliness, depression and low self-esteem, which can lead to suicide ideation, isolation, cutting, etc. By recognizing and addressing the hurtful covert behaviors of peer aggression, we can promote a positive and productive environment in our schools and in our communities. Our Girls Unlimited program is designed to provide 6th and 7th grade girls with an open and safe forum for discussion of the issues and pressures that face them in these volatile times. In addition to giving girls the opportunity for personal expression, the goal of the program is to provide an environment where they can develop social/emotional awareness, empathy and responsibility within the context of demonstrating respect for self and others. Each lesson is delivered by a trained educator.

- How to recognize their own emotions and treat themselves and others with kindness and respect.
 - Practical ways to manage their anger.
 - How to intervene when witnessing relational aggression.
 - The meaning of self-respect and self-care.
 - The value of trust.
 - The importance of women bonding together.
- Girls Unlimited believes that teaching young people emotional intelligence is as critical to their development as teaching them math, science and social studies. One does not become a good citizen of the world without instruction, expectation and role models. The messages bombarding girls today are not always positive ones. The pressure to be thin, sexy, and yes, sometimes mean, is in our magazines, on television and on the Internet. It is our hope that The Peace Center can combat some of those messages by empowering young women to be their best, most peaceful selves.

ALLERGIES

We work carefully to educate our staff about food allergies. Campers with food allergies should contact the Parks & Recreation Customer Service Desk for additional information. Our staff is not trained to administer medications of any kind.

DROP-OFF / PICKUP PROCEDURES

Camp starts at 8:00 AM and goes until 5:15 PM Monday thru Friday. If you are late picking up your child one minute past 5:15 PM you will be charged \$20 cash for every 15 minutes - we are not a daycare. When picking up your child you will be required to bring with you the pickup card you will receive after all the necessary paperwork has been handed in. Each camper's safety is our number one priority and the pickup cards help ensure that your child does not go home with any unauthorized person. The first day of camp signs will be posted and staff will be directing your drop-off procedures. The same will go for pickup.
